## FOREWORD



As your Branch president and Chief Constable of Derbyshire Constabulary it brings me great pleasure to update you all on what has been happening in Derbyshire over the last year. As you will know, policing both nationally and locally has continued to face a number of challenges. However, these challenges and the ever-changing landscape are what drives policing to improve, evolve and provide the best service we can to the communities that we serve.

Since my last update, the Covid-19 pandemic has taken many twists and turns, a more optimistic viewpoint last summer was quickly de-railed by the onset of the Omicron variant at the end of the year which saw infection rates grow at an alarming rate. However, what has remained constant is the fantastic work undertaken by my staff and officers to ensure that the service we deliver to the public has not been compromised. In fact through the pandemic we have found more efficient ways of working, whether that be through the use of virtual meetings or an increased focus on using technology so that officers can work in a more agile way.

Throughout the year we have continued to work with our partners within the Local Resilience Forum ensuring that we have taken a joined-up approach in our response to not only managing the pandemic internally and externally but also with a focus on returning to business as usual, taking with us all of the positive change that the pandemic has forced upon us.

The important Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) agenda has grown in focus and impetus across policing and in many other areas of society. We recognise the impact on trust and confidence this has, especially with women and girls. We continue to improve our response to VAWG-related incidents and crimes, working under our key organisational priority theme of vulnerability and led by my deputy DCC Meynell. We are also working with the PCC across the city and county to develop a partnership VAWG strategy and action plan.

The force has worked hard this year to make a number of positive changes and improvements to benefit our communities, through a better response, and make it easier for our staff to do so. We have increased Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) numbers over the past few years, a position we are committed to maintain, as community policing is at the heart of what we do. Moreover, we have welcomed the opportunity to increase our officer numbers through the Uplift programme. We have seen improvements in our Contact

Management Department where we have used technology to provide a more effective response to calls for service. New teams have also been created which are focussed on resolving incidents and crimes earlier, meaning greater victim focus and work is taken from our front-line officers.

Over 3,000 staff and officers have been trained in problem-solving throughout the last 12 months. This evidence-based approach highlights the opportunities to work with our communities and partners to identify recurring problems and implement long-term solutions to prevent the problems persisting; thereby reducing vulnerability and demand.

The force continues to place a focus on road safety with many operations running across the course of the year aimed at making our roads safer. We also have a well-established Rural Crime Team who are dedicated to tackling this bespoke type of crime.

We have made extensive improvements in the ever-growing area of public protection. Protecting the most vulnerable from harm is a key requirement of policing. We have invested in increased detectives and other resources into relevant units, refocusing efforts on protecting victims and pursuing those who cause most harm. We have created new units, such as within the area of domestic abuse, ensuring consistency in risk assessment and response, and focusing on children who might live in an environment of domestic abuse.

We saw a new PCC in 2021, with Commissioner Angelique Foster being elected. I am pleased to say she sees the importance in continuing to invest in our estate, and the programme to replace our aging estate is growing at pace. We know that buying and building new police stations sends a clear positive message to communities that we continue to intend to be visible within them. As part of these improvements, we are committed to improving our gyms alongside other welfare provisions as part of our wellbeing work.

The picture around our crime and demand tells us that they are both still on the rise, with our data showing increases in crimes reported, incidents recorded and a year-on-year increase for 999 and 101 calls into our Control Room. Add these increases to the challenging year that we have faced, and you will see that it has been another incredibly tough year in policing. However, the force has responded positively, seeking to improve, with officers and staff working extremely hard to make a difference to the communities they serve.

That is why I really do value the support that NARPO offers, not only to our retired officers but to our policing family in general. This ongoing support is absolutely welcomed by all of us. I know at times Derbyshire police officers and staff find much of the negative narrative that can exist around policing as difficult to deal with. However, they remain committed and working hard to service our communities.

I offer all officers and staff retiring from the force an exit meeting where I am able to properly thank them for their service. At these meetings I always take pleasure in handing the officers a NARPO folder and highlighting to them the importance of colleagues staying connected. Thank you for the support you give them.

We remain committed to tackling our challenges and driving improvements to deliver an excellent service to our communities.

I hope that you have found this update helpful, and I wish all of the NARPO members the very best for the year ahead.

### **Sports Club**
