Welfare matters!

Congratulations, you've retired! So, what happens now?

One of the main responsibilities of NARPO is the welfare of its members. In fact this is laid out in Rule 2 (a) of its Constitution which reads:- "The objective for which the Association was established is to safeguard the rights of members and to promote measures for their welfare, with particular regard to pensions." Whilst NARPO nationally has the prime responsibility for the issue of the Police Pension, increases to it and anomalies within the rules, at a Branch level the issue of "welfare" is looked at more widely and on a more personal level.

For most people the act of retiring from the "force", either the Derbyshire Constabulary or elsewhere, is seen simply as taking the next step in life's journey and has no adverse effect upon their physical, emotional or mental wellbeing, whilst for others this can be a highly traumatic event in their lives. Others may well have had ongoing issues prior to and/or at the time of their retirement. In some cases, these issues may well have contributed to their decision to leave the force.

NARPO in Derbyshire sees as a priority the task of identifying members who, for whatever reason may be struggling to come to terms with retirement, or who having already retired are facing other issues adversely affecting them and possibly their loved ones. As an organisation, we do not have the expertise, experience or qualifications to even attempt to diagnose what is happening to people in this respect. What we do have though is a large number of ex cops – men and women - with the experience of dealing with people in distress or facing major difficulties and traumas in their lives. Many of them I am sure would be more than willing, even enthusiastic, to put their experience and knowledge to good use in assisting their fellow retirees. Many may already be doing this in their own private way, talking to mates who perhaps are facing illness or suggesting a way forward for someone with a problem etc.

We want to harness this experience and enthusiasm by identifying NARPO members across the county who are willing to do this on a slightly more formal basis, under the remit of NARPO. We would like to talk to potential volunteers about this, what would be required of them, how they would communicate with the Branch committee etc. If you would like to know more about this potential role, then please email me at dave.ashley782@hotmail.co.uk Thank you.

Health and Welfare - What's on offer to NARPO members at present

Although once you retire you may feel as if you are on your own in respect of health and welfare, there are actually a number of organisations and systems that are still available to you. Below is a brief note about some of them. In subsequent editions of the Newsletter, you will find further, more detailed information.

The Police Treatment Centres: These are located at Harrogate, Yorkshire and Auchterarder, Scotland. They offer residential physiotherapy, remote physiotherapy outpatient appointments and a retired wellbeing programme during retirement. You need to join at £4.50p per month to take advantage. Health Assured

Retirees from the Derbyshire Constabulary continue to have access to all the services of the Force's Employee Assistance Provider, **Health Assured** for up to 3 months following their retirement date. There is a free, confidential, 24-hour helpline available to support you and your immediate family through any of life's issues or problems 0800-028-0199 for three months following retirement. Police Care UK

Police Care UK is a charity for serving and veteran police officers and staff, volunteers, and their families. They are independent of the police service and are funded entirely by donations and fundraising. They receive no money from government or forces for their work. You can access practical, emotional and financial support that is confidential and impartial by submitting a referral for you or someone you know to **Police Care UK**

Mutual Welfare Fund

You have to be a member of the fund from when you joined. However, the object of the fund shall include the provision of welfare benefits to members and pensioned members. All payments are at the discretion of the MWF committee. Members are assured that in circumstances of hardship the Welfare Fund may as always be approached for assistance, either directly or via the Secretary.

The Derbyshire Benevolent Trust

This is an independent organisation offering welfare and benevolent services and facilities for its members and their families. Their services are exclusively available to serving Derbyshire police officers and police staff and to retired members of Derbyshire Constabulary. "Life here in Skåne, Sweden is very good. I love the fact that there is little traffic on the roads (the traffic in the UK now scares the hell out of me whenever I venture back). The downside, though, is that Swedish motorists cannot drive, they have no road sense nor driving skills. The number of times you meet one, in a world of his own, driving towards you on your side of the road, are too numerous to mention. You need your wits about you at all times.

I occasionally manage to look at various police Facebook sites, such as Not Narpo North; DC Collars (Derbyshire Constabulary Collar Numbers); and Pannal Ash Dishforth PTCs. I love to see that many of my old colleagues frequently post on these sites. It keeps me up to date with things.

Out here in Sweden I do love cooking some good old fashioned Derbyshire favourites (all out of necessity) by making my own Derbyshire oatcakes (a must for a proper breakfast) curing and cold-smoking my own bacon, making my own pork-and-tomato sausages, baking decent bread cobs and making utterly delicious pork pies and sausage rolls. The smells prompt the locals to come sniffing around whenever I've got my apron on, and they love all these Derbyshire specialities.



I also have a large workshop and studio on the ground floor of my house, which in the past has been used as a cow-shed, a blacksmith's forge and a cobbler's shop. I now use it to do a spot of woodworking (house-name signs are a long-time passion) and artwork. I also paint portraits in oils, do linocuts prints and draw scraperboard pictures.

I am also still a keen birdwatcher and have recently started to photograph many of the 84 bird species that I have recorded so far in and from my garden. Being bored is not on my agenda and I frequently find there are insufficient hours in the day to achieve all I want to. When I was out birdwatching last summer, I saw this gorgeous Beautiful Demoiselle damselfly on some reeds in my favourite stream. I hadn't seen one before so I was quite excited to photograph it.



It's perhaps important to show that living in a strange country that has weird and arcane customs doesn't mean that you have to give up on the things you like. I may be absent but I'll always be a Derbyshire lad at heart. Around eight years ago, Sean Murphy asked me to write an article about how and why I moved to Sweden and he published that in a NARPO

newsletter. A number of old colleagues got in touch with me as a result of that article. Perhaps the same will happen again.
