Widows Pension for Life – Petition.

An enduring injustice in the 1987 Police Pension scheme is that widows or widowers' pension under the scheme lose their pension if they remarry or cohabit. Although improvements have been made to this aspect of the police pension in subsequent schemes, the provisions were not retrospective; so most police widows are still in the position of losing their pension in these circumstances. NARPO believe this provision is demeaning and not an appropriate condition in a modern age and should be abolished.

We encourage members to sign the petition, a link to which can be found on the national website www.narpo.org – click on 'Notices'.

Injury on Duty.

If you recall in the last Annual Report I mentioned that Headquarters were contemplating whether to resume reviews of Injury Awards made to ex Police Officers in order to comply with the latest Home Office guidance and Police Pension Regulations.

At present a report has been submitted to the Head of Human Resources for progression through the ranks. The author of the report suggests two options, **1.** That only those below 70 years of age be reviewed or **2.** Just review those awarded injury on duty 10 years ago, bearing in mind those reviewed only 3 years ago.

My advice is to wait and see how the report is progressed and as soon as I hear anything I will update you.

Derbyshire Benevolent Society

The '**Derbyshire Benevolent Trust**' has been up and running for well over a year. The object of the Trust is "**To provide and permit welfare and benevolent facilities for members and their families**". The main focus of the Trust will initially be 'Wellbeing' in both physical and financial terms and as such the services offered should contribute to peace of mind through awareness seminars, financial advice surgeries, and complimentary therapies, such as yoga, physiotherapy and mindfulness. All retired Officers and Staff of Derbyshire Constabulary are entitled to use the services and facilities of the Trust, most are free to members. Unfortunately a lot of retired members, whether in NARPO or not, suffer from problems caused by bereavement, financial,

loneliness or the strains of the 'job'. The Trust organise 'Pop Up' Offices around the County where you can arrange to speak to qualified financial and wellbeing advisors or administrators of the Trust. The Trust have agreed terms with a firm of Solicitors and Financial Advisors that allow members to have a free one hour consultation and private and with complete confidentiality. Sports Club

Apparently we are having problems with the 'Corporate Passes'. I have been asked by the Sports Club to make it clear that only the Sports Club member can collect the tickets and that they must be in their possession at all times. Current staff and officers are asked to bring their warrant or ID card when collecting the tickets and NARPO members are asked to produce their NARPO card. I would suggest that if you have a pension slip which shows you are paying into the Sports Club and or Lottery, it would avoid any embarrassment.

Apparently there have been a number of occasions recently when people other than the Sports Club members have tried to collect the passes, and this can make things difficult for all concerned. Just to remind members, those who have retired will continue to pay £4-20 a month and continue to do so after the age of 65 years. However existing members of the Sports Club, who were 65 years of age prior to the 1st March, 2013, will continue to be classed as Honorary Members and pay no subscription. If you are still in the Lottery, it will show on your pension slip that monies are being taken out. You would recoup your monthly subscription by a visit to Chatsworth House or Haddon Hall.

NARPO News

NARPO is made up from retired Police Officers in England, Wales and the Isle of Man together with their spouses, widows and widowers. Its major objective was stated to be, '**To safeguard the rights of members, and to promote measures for their welfare with particular regard to pensions**'. That is still true – but its range of activities to achieve that aim, have widened significantly.

The Association originally attempted to obtain negotiating rights, but the creation of The Police Federation, with statutory powers, prevented further progress in that area. Despite this, the Association has progressed its image and abilities and now represents over 100 branches and around 100,000 Officers.

Originally the National body published a regular 'Bulletin', as a means of passing on information down to Branch level. This was superseded in 1992 by the 'NARPO News', published quarterly to all members.....it has been and continues to be a great success story. Its quality, content and production values are consistently first class. Remember its your magazine. Please take time to read it. It covers a large range of subjects and you can get your ideas/comments published by calling the National Office at Wakefield.
